

Sec. 106-289. — Walks and Runs

Applications for activities or events that involve leaving the primary event location on public or private properties that will utilize public sidewalks, streets and/or bike paths, and other right-of-way areas for the purpose of organized walks or runs of any distance, shall receive Town Council approval prior to the issuance of a special event permit.

The following procedure and criteria for approving a walk/run event, as defined in section 106.256 and add section 106.256 back in with just the first definition or put the definition above, shall be as follows:

- a) Applications for walk/run events shall be submitted as required in section 106-282.
- b) The Town Manager or his/her designee will submit a staff report, the special event application and supporting documentation to the Town Council for its consideration and final approval.
- c) Approval of a walk/run event application shall be subject to the following requirements:

1. Adequacy of the location of the start and finish line relative to public safety and/or the impact to the residents; and

2. The date(s) and start time(s) of the event, and/or whether or not it will conflict with a town sponsored event or another event in close proximity of the proposed event.

3. The maximum number of events held in the requested route area is not over three in one year, *not adversely impact adjacent residents' lives.* *and will*

4. The residents in the area are not adverse to the event being approved based upon the interruption of their quiet *1 per month.*

enjoyment of their property and/or traffic and/or parking and/ or congestion issues.

5. The maximum number of persons allowed by the Town to participate in a walk/run event is: (how many participate in the Turkey Trot?) ~~350~~ max

6. The maximum amount of participants, planned staff members and spectators will not have an adverse effect on parking and/or traffic and/ or congest the Town's Street.

7. The event will not begin set-up or clean-up before 8am A.M. if near any residential living unless approved by Town Council.

8. The event and use of public streets may not last for more than ____ hours, unless approved by Council. (How long was the Turkey Trot? The Walk of Hope?) addressed

10. On page 10, the applicant agrees to abide by the Town's noise ordinance as outlined in section 42-197, and a copy shall be provided to the applicant.
