2. Case # CE 26-643, Vessel Death Star – Tanner F. Martin (owner):
Violation of Chapter 74, Section 74-267 of the Town of Palm Beach Code of Ordinances states. Prohibition on extended overnight anchoring. No vessel shall anchor overnight within the jurisdictional waters of the Town of Palm Beach for a period of one hour or more between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise for more than 30 days within any consecutive six-month period.
3. Case # CE 26-639, Vessel Tantara – Michael Benton (owner):
Violation of Chapter 74, Section 74-267 of the Town of Palm Beach Code of Ordinances states. Prohibition on extended overnight anchoring. No vessel shall anchor overnight within the jurisdictional waters of the Town of Palm Beach for a period of one hour or more between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise for more than 30 days within any consecutive six-month period.
4. Case # CE 26-641, Vessel Windwalker – Michelle Leigh Hay (owner):
Violation of Chapter 74, Section 74-267 of the Town of Palm Beach Code of Ordinances states. Prohibition on extended overnight anchoring. No vessel shall anchor overnight within the jurisdictional waters of the Town of Palm Beach for a period of one hour or more between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise for more than 30 days within any consecutive six-month period.
5. Case # CE 26-644, Vessel Falcon – Donald Smith (owner):
Violation of Chapter 74, Section 74-267 of the Town of Palm Beach Code of Ordinances states.

Prohibition on extended overnight anchoring. No vessel shall anchor overnight within the jurisdictional waters of the Town of Palm Beach for a period of one hour or more between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise for more than 30 days within any consecutive six-month period.

6. Case # CE 26-772, Vessel Margaret Anna – Travis Lowen (owner):
Violation of Chapter 74, Section 74-267 of the Town of Palm Beach Code of Ordinances states. Prohibition on extended overnight anchoring. No vessel shall anchor overnight within the jurisdictional waters of the Town of Palm Beach for a period of one hour or more between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise for more than 30 days within any consecutive six-month period.
