MINUTES OF THE SEAVIEW PARK COMMISSION MEETING HELD

JANUARY 23, 1991

I. CALL TO ORDER: A meeting of the Seaview Park Commission was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Daniel Hanley at 1:00 PM on January 23, 1991 in the Recreation Center. Commission members in attendance were; Mr. Hanley, Mrs. Newman, Mr. Broberg, Mr. Russell and Mr. Kemble. Staff members in attendance were; Mr. Bitzer, Mr. Brown, Mr. Hay acting Tennis Pro and Ms. Reedy. Mrs. Coniglio and Mr. Myers did not attend the meeting.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion was made by Mr. Kemble to approve the minutes of the meeting of December 4, 1990. Mr. Broberg said he felt there were some inaccuracies in those minutes. Mr. Hanley asked if the minutes had been circulated. Mr. Bitzer answered affirmatively. Mrs. Newman asked if the inaccuracies were of any significance. Mr. Broberg said they weren't of great significance but, he felt it should be mentioned for the sake of accuracy in record keeping. Mr. Broberg brought up the fact that when the members of the Commission asked who the candidates were to fill the Tennis Pro position they were informed that no decision had been made, but it was reported in the paper the next day that a candidate had been chosen and the members of the Commission had not been informed of the selection. Mr. Bitzer said that at that meeting he had informed the Commission that there was a selection group which reviewed the applications of the candidates for the Tennis Pro position, but that a final decision had not been made. He said any changes to the contract would have to be approved by the Town Council and that the recommended candidate would have to be approved by the Town Manager. Mr. Bitzer said he had no idea where the reporter got his information.

Mr. Bitzer said that there had been inaccuracies in a number of articles and that he had a long discussion with Mr. Anderson. He said Mr. Anderson had apologized for any errors which had occurred.

Mr. Hanley asked for approval of the minutes which was seconded by Mrs. Newman and the vote was unanimous for approval.

III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Motion was made by Mr. Russell to approve the agenda. Seconded by Mr. Broberg, motion carried.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A. Status Report Tennis Pro-Manager Appointment.

Mr. Bitzer said the Town Council's Administrative & Personnel Committee reviewed the proposed revisions to the Tennis Pro Manager agreement on January 15th and have recommended that this item be considered by the full Council at the February 12th Town Council meeting. Mr. Bitzer said that he hoped that an agreement will be approved at the February 12th Council meeting and that an agreement will be signed by the Town Manager prior to March 1, 1991.

Mr. Russell said he had recently read the newspaper article and was disturbed by what he read regarding the contract not being approved at the Administrative level. He said that 3 of the members of the Seaview Park Commission appeared before the Administrative & Personnel Committee to speak in favor of the proposed contract. He said he understood that the matter had been referred to the full Council and asked Mr. Bitzer to elaborate on the subject. Mr. Bitzer said the Committee didn't make any recommendation other than that the matter be considered by the full Council. He said that at one point the Administrative & Personnel Committee felt that the matter of the Tennis Pro should be considered a budget item and be referred to the Finance & Taxation Committee of the Town Council because there was such an emphasis on the financial aspect of the contract.

Mr. Broberg said it was his impression that the Mayor felt that the Recreation Center and Seaview Park tennis courts should have a 100% rate of return of funds and be totally self supporting and she was an influential force on the Council people. He said that to resolve the entire matter satisfactorily they were going to have to convince a majority of the Council that the Tennis Courts should not be compared to the Golf Course as to whether or not they should be self supporting.

Mr. Bitzer said there was no comparison between the Golf Course and the Tennis Courts because a major part of the income received by the Golf Course comes from nonresidents, and that would be very difficult for the Tennis Courts because of the limited number of courts available. He said there were other revenue generating areas of the Golf Course such as cart rentals and the driving range which enables the Golf Course to be self supporting.

Mr. Kemble said that he had attended the Administrative and Personnel Committee meeting and he felt that the Committee tried to

push aside the matter of the Tennis Pro contract and not deal with it at all. He said he was not encouraged by the response they received from the Committee. Mr. Kemble said that the Mayor indicated that she had received newspaper articles and letters from newspaper people indicating that the per capita income in the Town of Palm Beach is \$30,000 and the salary of the Tennis Pro should be along those lines.

Mr. Russell said there seemed to be a difference in issues between the profitability point and the 15% of the Tennis Pro's fees which are returned to the Town. He said it was his understanding that there was an objection to the removal of the 15% issue. He said that point did not relate to the profitability of the facility but to the Administrative workability of a contract for a Tennis Pro. Mr. Russell said that the 15% is not workable and should not be placed in the Pro's contract.

Mr. Kemble said all those issues had been discussed, to some degree at the Administrative & Personnel meeting on January 15th. He said the Council has the power and the right to do as they wish, but he felt the Seaview Park Commission should make their feelings known to the Council. He questioned the significance of the Mayor attending the Administration & Personnel Committee meeting and presenting such a forceful negative attitude towards the Tennis Program. Mr. Kemble said he felt the Mayor's attitude was a matter of a lack of knowledge of the Tennis Program.

Mr. Hanley said the Contract Review Committee had tried to focus on what was appropriate in terms of compensation to the Pro as a number. He said they suggested to the Committee a figure between \$45,000 and \$50,000 dollars but that Engler Anderson published an article in the paper which stated that there would be an increase in expenses of \$8,000 which was incorrect. He said the actual difference would be somewhere between \$5,000 and \$6,000 dollars. Mr. Hanley said the \$45 to \$50 thousand dollar figure was probably \$10,000 dollars less than the Pro was making a few years ago before the 15% took effect. He said the question was; what is the proper salary for the Tennis Pro in the Town of Palm Beach. Mr. Hanley said he felt that if eliminating the 15% changes the percentages of recovery for the Tennis Program then that would be a separate issue which should be addressed in the overall fee structure.

Mr. Kemble wondered if Mayor Marix had attended the Administrative & Personnel meeting on the basis of the newspaper article, and if that was the case he felt someone should explain to the Mayor that the article was incorrect. He said it should also be explained that the substantial increases in the Tennis fees have caused a drop in the Tennis usage.

Mr. Russell said he agreed with Mr. Kemble, and suggested that possibly the Recreation Director could meet with the Mayor and discuss the problems with the Tennis Programs. Mrs. Newman reminded the Commission that the Mayor does not vote on issues at the Council meetings, and maybe it would be better if a letter was sent to each individual Councilmember. Mr. Broberg agreed with Mrs. Newman.

Mr. Bitzer said the Commissions feelings would be transmitted to the Mayor and Town Council through the distribution of the minutes of this meeting prior the the February 12th Council meeting. He said that a few of the items which he discussed was the Tennis Pro Shop, and the 73% recovery in the Tennis Programs as compared to an average of 40 to 45% recovery in other Municipalities.

Mr. Bitzer said that at the Administrative and Personnel meeting he had also commented that in 1887 the Tennis Pro netted about \$59,000, in 1988 it was \$58,000 and then in 1989 the 15% became effective and the figure was about \$49,000. He said they estimated that in 1990 in would be somewhere around \$50,000 and the same in 1991. Mr. Bitzer said this was not only a Tennis Pro position but it was a Tennis Pro Manager position and he estimated the managerial duties would take approximately 2 hours per day and that would take time away from his teaching.

Mr. Russell said he felt it was part of the purpose of the Town to provide some subsidy to the Recreation Department so they will be able to provide a quality program to the citizens of the Town. He said he agreed with Mr. Bitzer regarding the 2 hours of management time required by the Tennis Pro and that it should be taken into consideration in the negotiations of the Tennis Pro's contract. Mr. Russell said he was in full agreement with Mr. Hanley's earlier comments regarding the proposed Tennis Pro's contract.

Mr. Bitzer said that the Contract Review Group and the Staff recommendation was to offer an agreement which was competitive in the market and would attract and retain a quality Pro. He said he felt they had presented a very conservative recommendation to the Administrative & Personnel Committee and the Town Council will also receive the recommendation.

Mr. Kemble said he would like to see the matter resolved as it affected the future Tennis Pro's job and future. Mr. Bitzer said it was the prerogative of any members of the Commission to attend the February 12th Council meeting and fill in any information he might have missed.

Mr. Hanley said he felt that it had always been the consensus of the Seaview Park Commission that if they could attract and retain a qualified Pro and provide continuity to the Tennis program on a long term basis that the membership would increase. He said although it

was an assumption he felt that the membership would increase and 100% of that revenue goes to the Town. Mr. Hanley said that memberships and use of the courts vs. tennis lessons were not two different segments. He said there were members who also take lessons and they are all residents. Mr. Hanley asked for a motion that the contract as recommended by the Seaview Park Commission, the Staff and the Town Manager be approved by the Town Council at its February 12th meeting, and if the Council has any doubt as to the appropriateness of the proposed contract, that doubt should be resolved in favor of the recommendations and to approve the contract.

Mr. Russell made a motion to recommend that the Town Council approve the recommended contract for the Tennis Pro. Seconded by Mr. Broberg, motion carried.

Mr. Hay said he agreed with Mr. Bitzer about the administrative duties taking about 2 hours a day but he said in his past experiences he found that the time involved in those duties were closer to 3 hours. He said he didn't have a large staff and he felt it was important to be accessible to the people and with all the programs offered by the Recreation Department he thought it would take 3 to 4 hours a day dealing with the administrative duties.

Mr. Broberg said he felt the Seaview Park Commission should draft a letter directed to the Mayor and the Town Council explaining what a Recreational Tennis Court Center means to the Town vs. returning 100% of expenses.

B. Status Report Tennis Court Repair & Drainage.

Mr. Bitzer said the Tennis Court repairs included patching and line replacement and the drainage work has been completed. He said the completed work looked good and has improved court playability and reduced the time necessary to complete daily court maintenance.

C. Status Report Athletic Field Maintenance

Mr. Bitzer said the Building and Grounds Maintenance Division has advised him that the spray unit will be delivered in a week to 10 days. He said the new lawn mower has been received and is in operation. Mr. Broberg asked if Miss Bruegman could inspect the fields on a quarterly basis. Mr. Bitzer said that had already asked Miss Bruegman to make periodic inspections.

D. Status Report Tennis Clinic Reorganization

Mr. Bitzer said there was a question regarding one of the Tennis Clinics and it's relationship to the Palm Beach Day Schools Tennis Team. He asked Mr. Hay for his comments on the Tennis Teams.

Mr. Hay said there was some concern about the Day School students coming to the Recreation Facility during the Clinics. He said they felt an obligation to continue with the Day School program so the teams would be able to complete their play-off matches. Mr. Hay said it was not a problem now because the season was over, but he felt it could become a problem next fall when the Day School may be looking for courts. He said that could become an issue next fall when they would have to deal with court allotment.

V. NEW BUSINESS:

Status Report Tennis Pro Shop Fundraising.

Mr. Hanley said the original loan was for the Tennis Pro Shop was \$42,531.00. He said with all the pledges and monies received to date they were about \$5,141 dollars short of the amount needed to pay off the loan, but he said the good news was that they had until August 1992 to repay the loan.

Mr. Russell said that the members of the Seaview Park Commission had worked very hard, personally donated funds, solicited funds from others and spent considerable time and effort in making the Tennis Pro Shop a reality. He said they felt like they were very supportive of the Town and they felt they should receive support from the Town Council on proposals such as the contract for the Tennis Pro. Mr. Russell said he was concerned by what he has read in the newspapers and from the discussions at today's meeting that the support from the Town Council would not be forthcoming. He said he hoped the lack of support was from lack of correct information received by the Council because of an incorrect newspaper article.

Mr. Broberg said he felt the proposed letter to the Council would help to alleviate that situation. Mr. Kemble said he hoped that would be the case, but he said he had invested a great deal of time and effort into making the Pro Shop a reality. He said they were \$5,000 dollars short in pledges for reaching the 100% figure and also there were \$10,000 in pledges which have been made but not collected, and there is always a possibility that they won't be paid. Mr. Kemble said he was becoming tired of serving on a Public Commission whose suggestions and recommendations are constantly ignored.

B. Proposed Recreation Center Teen Program Fees

Mr. Bitzer said in July 1990 the Seaview Park Commission recommended the after school Youth Program fees as proposed by the Staff. These fees were approved by the Town Council at the August Council meeting. Mr. Bitzer said at the September 26th Seaview Park Commission meeting the Staff advised the Commission that the after school program was highly successful with an average of 35 to 40 participants each day. Mr. Bitzer said however, that the program was not working with the teenagers and that they should be studying possibilities for an alternate program for this age group. He said the Commission indicated that they felt this was an Administrative matter and should be handled as such. Mr. Bitzer said they had given this item a great deal of study and were considering recommending an annual Teen Program fee of \$50.00 for residents of the Town, and \$100.00 for nonresidents.

Mr. Bitzer said that since the direct cost of the Teen Association activities are self supporting and that no funds are budgeted for this group in the Departments operating budget, he said he would recommend that 50% of the fees go to the Palm Beach Teen Association to help run their activities. He said the direct cost is minimal and consists primarily of staff which is estimated to be about 3 hours per week at a cost of approximately \$2,000 per year. Mr. Bitzer said he estimated that the 50% of the fee to the Town would recover this direct cost and the Teen Program would remain self supporting.

Mr. Russell said he had some reservations about an arrangement of a 50/50 split of the fees between the Teen Association and the Town. He said the 15% of the Tennis Pro's fees which was returned to the Town was clearly not workable. He said he would be reluctant to approve a 50/50 arrangement for the Teen group. Mr. Russell asked if an adult would be responsible for the management of the Teen Program's bank account.

Mr. Bitzer said the money would come into the Town and then a check would be written to the Teen Association account on a monthly basis. Mr. Bitzer said that in order for funds to be moved either into or out of the Teen Association account, the transaction has to be signed by one of the Board Members and the Teen Association advisor. Mr. Brown said that the Teen Association had a Treasurer and she maintained a record of all transactions and as the advisor, he kept the check book.

Mr. Bitzer said that there was an additional fee which is set by the Teen Association for their larger weekly programs such as dances, pizza and movie nights.

Mr. Russell asked if the program would be only for residents and nonresidents who attend school in Palm Beach? Mr. Bitzer said yes,

however, they would also be allowed to attend the programs as a guest of a member of the Teen Program Association.

Mr. Hanley asked if the Teen account was a separate account from the Town. Mr. Brown said it was. Mr. Hanley asked Mr. Brown how many members were there in the Teen Association. Mr. Brown said that on a constant basis there were between 30 to 40 regular participants, but when they have special events such as the "Lock-In" there is a larger number of participants.

Mr. Kemble suggested that given all the problems they have had in the past, that Mr. Bitzer and the Staff should simplify the Teen Program as much as possible from its inception. Mr. Hanley said that based on their experiences that if there was some way they could collect \$25.00 and deposit it in the Town's account and collect a separate \$25.00 and put it in the Teen's account that would be better than putting \$50 in the Town's account and then at the end of the month try to calculate the amount that should go to the Teen account and return that amount back to Mr. Brown.

Mr. Russell said his feeling was that if this was put to a vote it would not pass unanimously because of the 50/50 proposal. Mr. Bitzer asked what would the Commission recommend? Mr. Hanley said he thought that since the Town's fee being a "users fee" would be \$25.00 for residents and \$50.00 for nonresidents he would suggest that the Teen Association should have a separate fee for whatever they wish to do with it. Mr. Russell said they had had so many problems with the sharing arrangements of the Tennis lessons that he couldn't endorse any other sharing arrangements between the Town and Seaview Park without knowing more of the details of the proposed sharing agreements.

Mr. Hanley said he didn't feel the Commission had any objection to the dollar amounts, and suggested that each participant write two checks. Mr. Kemble suggested that they rely on Mr. Brown's judgement in this matter.

Mr. Russell made a motion to accept the Staff recommendation that fees for the Teen Association be \$25.00 for residents and \$50.00 for nonresidents. Seconded by Mr. Broberg, motion carried.

VI. ANY OTHER MATTERS:

Mr. Bitzer said this would be the last meeting for Mr. Hanley and Mr. Russell unless there should be a special meeting. He said they had served two terms the last of which will expire in February. Mr. Bitzer said he wished to express his deep appreciation on behalf of the Staff for the volunteer time and effort

that Mr. Russell and Mr. Hanley have dedicated to the Town's Recreation Department.

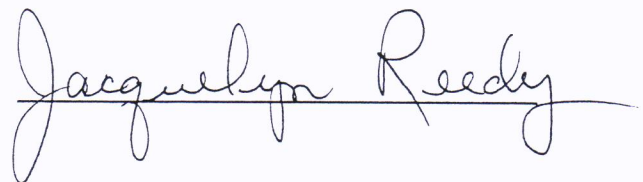
Mr. Hanley said that even though this was their last official meeting he would attend the February 12th Town Council meeting. He said he had enjoyed serving on the Seaview Park Commission and he wished to thank all the members of the Commission for their help. Mr. Russell said he also wished to thank every one for their help. He said there had been a lot of challenges but he felt the accomplishments they had achieved were very worth while.

Mr. Bitzer said the Council would acknowledge Mr. Hanley and Mr. Russell's service to the Town in a formal presentation probably at the March 12th Council meeting. He said the Town Manager's Office would be in touch with them.

Mr. Kemble asked what was being done about nominations to fill the two vacancies? Mr. Bitzer said anyone wishing to serve on a Town Board or Commission should submit a letter to the Mayor and Town Council expressing their interest in serving on the Commission or Board and then their request would be considered by the Town Council.

VII. ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, motion was made by Mr. Russell to adjourn. Seconded by Mr. Kemble, the motion carried.
